He is from Australia, and currently lives in Nagoya. Becoming interested in Japan under the influence of his grandfather, he first visited the country at age 17. He made his debut as a professional radio DJ at the tender age of 18. Since he debuted in both Australia and Japan, he has built a brilliant career as a leading radio professional until now!

Storyteller: Matsuyo Kawamura (storyteller about the Kumano Kodo Iseji Route)

She was born and grew up in Kumano City, Mie Prefecture, and still lives in the same city. She has so far guided nearly 50,000 people around Kumano Kodo, working as a bus tour guide for eight years and as a Kumano Kodo storyteller for 14 years. After the Kumano Kodo pilgrimage routes were inscribed on UNESCO's World Heritage List, she took the initiative in founding a group of English-speaking guides for the Kumano Kodo Iseji Route.

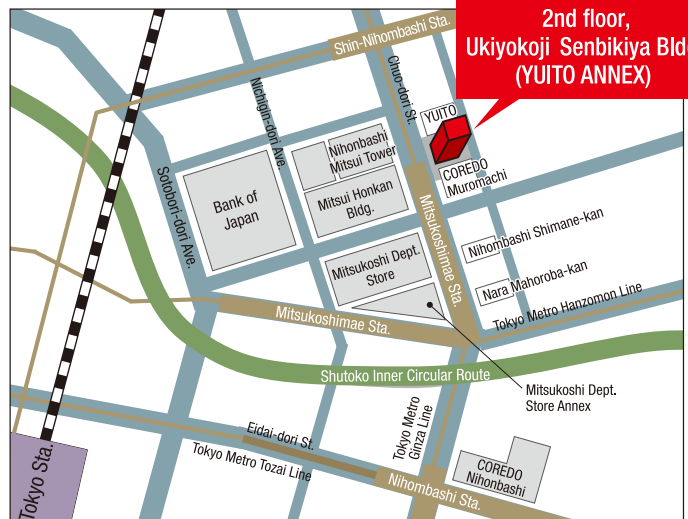
